TESTING AND IDENTIFICATION TIMELINE

Part-Time Advanced Academic Services Levels II and III All decisions regarding advanced academic part-time, school-based services are made at the local school. Parents or guardians who would like their child considered for these services should submit a *Part-Time School-Based Services Levels II and III Referral Form* to the Advanced Academic Resource Teacher (AART) at the local school. Students must be attending Fairfax County Public Schools in order to be considered for advanced academic part-time, school-based services. Parents may appeal the local school decision by contacting the principal with new information.

Full-Time Advanced Academic Placement Level IV All decisions regarding full-time placement in Advanced Academic Programs are made by a central selection committee. A screening pool is created based on scores from FCPS-administered ability tests given to students in Grades 1-2. Parents or guardians may refer students in Grade 2 who are not in the screening pool and students in Grades 3-7 by submitting the *Level IV Referral Form*.

Testing Schedule

Schools administer tests to all FCPS students in Grades 1 and 2, and also to students in Grades 3-7 who are missing ability test scores, according to the timeline below. Parents or guardians may request **one** retest in Grade 2-7 during the fall testing cycle. Students must be enrolled in and attending FCPS in order to be tested. An ability test score is required for the screening process.

October 1-12

FCPS CogAT-Custom Form Grade 2 Test administered to all second grade students and to third through seventh grade students missing ability test scores or exercising their one-time retest option.

November 12-16

Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test administered to all students in Grade 1 and for certain students in Grades 2-7 who do not have an ability test score on file. Students whose parents and/or guardians have requested to use their one-time retest option may also test during this window.

February 11-15, 2019

Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test administered to certain students in Grades 2-7 who need an ability test score for Level IV screening.

For FCPS students newly enrolled in FCPS and attending after January 2018, and students not enrolled in FCPS.

PLEASE NOTE: Due to the tight timeframe, do not wait for test information to submit a referral if you would like your student screened. **No exceptions to the referral deadline are made.**

Full-time orientations held at Level IV sites (elementary school only). Orientations will not be held during spring break.

May 10, 2019

- Advanced Academic Programs Level IV Screening Summary Sheet Provided by school
- Ability Test Scores Provided by school, GMU, or state-licensed psychologist
- Advanced Academic Programs Level IV Referral Form Completed by parents, guardian, teacher, or student
- Gifted Behaviors Rating Scale with Commentary Provided by school
- Progress Reports Provided by school
- Achievement Test Scores (optional) Provided by school
- Parent/Guardian Questionnaire (optional) Provided by parents or guardian
- Student Work Samples limit 6 Up to 4 optional samples submitted by parents or guardian. School includes at least 2 work samples, at least one of a response to a critical/creative-thinking lesson
- Student Awards or Commendations limit 5 (optional) Submitted by parents or guardian
